What is Nihon-buyo

Nihon-buyo is Japanese traditional performing art, which is to dance to the Japanese classical music. It is also an attractive way to learn how to wear a kimono, etiquette, and Japanese culture, and it is still one of the popular culture classes for a wide range of age groups.

This is an activity for in-house hotel guests to experience Kamigata-Mai, a type of Nihon-buyo. "Kamigata-Mai" developed in Osaka and Kyoto in the Edo period (1603-1867), and is a traditional classical performing art of the Kamigata region.

The Nihon-buyo experience will be instructed slowly and carefully by Ms. Yoshie Wakahodo Yamamura of the Kamigata-Mai Yamamura school, and all in-house guests are welcome to participate. Please note that there is no kimono dressing experience.
